Congratulations to the Class of 2019! As we begin to close one school year, we have already begun planning for the next one, looking for ways to improve.

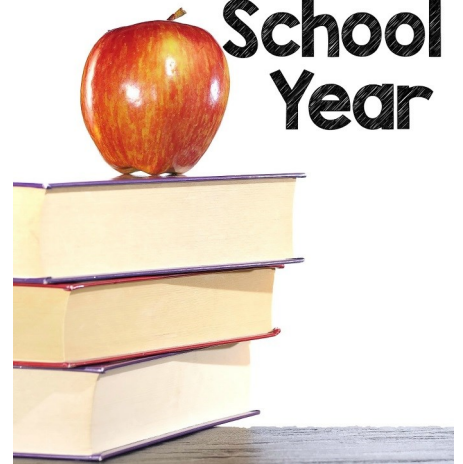

With the recent run of perfect, sunny weather, spring fever is now officially upon us! As you know, students may begin to lose focus on academics and start to become a little more social during this time of year. Please work with us to communicate to your child that it is important to stay focused until the end of the year. Our last day of attendance for students in the Jr.-Sr. High School is June 14. June also brings the administration of the New York State Regents Examinations as well as some local exams starting on June 17.

As far as transportation during Regents week, buses will run their regular routes in the morning and return trips will take students home at 11:30 am and 3:00 pm. Please take note that there will be no afternoon transportation to school for afternoon exams. If students are unable to arrange transportation for an afternoon exam, they will need to take the bus in the morning. The library will be open and they should plan to bring study materials or school work to be productive. Students will not be allowed to roam the building during the administration of these exams.

Many of our students will be tested during their regular classes during the last week of student attendance. We will also be administering the 8th grade Science test this year on June 3. Please make certain your child is in school every day so they do not miss their testing window. If your child is absent for any of the tests, they will need to make them up upon their return to school or may have to come in during Regents week. Please work with us to make certain that these last few months of school go as smoothly possible. If you have concerns regarding your child's grades, please contact their teacher immediately to ask for assistance. Please also review behavior and academic expectations with your child to help reinforce a strong and productive finish to the year.

June Exam Schedule

Remember that only students taking an exam on any given day should be present in school; the exception is vocational students at Carrier and Ormsby, **who will still have classes** with transportation provided.

Junior-Senior Prom

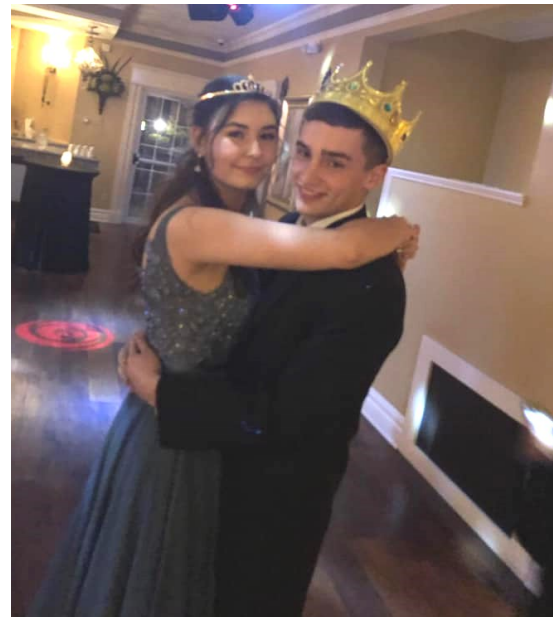

Father-Daughter Dance

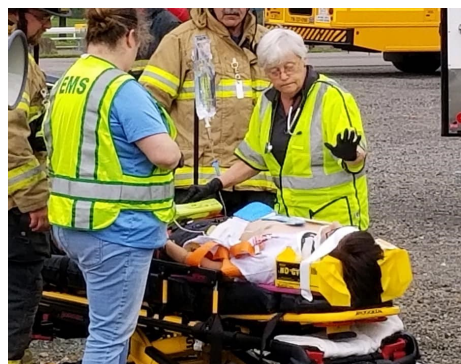

Health Clinic News

REQUIRED PHYSICALS

New York State Education Law requires that all entering students and all students in Grades Pre-K, K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 and 11 receive a physical examination prior to the start of school. A triennial examination is also required for pupils receiving Special Education Services. Please make plans to see your family's healthcare provider for this examination. If this is not done, your child will receive a physical at school by Southtowns Family Practice. The date for these exams has not been established as of yet; please continue to consult the school website or contact the health clinic of the school your child attends for more information. Only those students who submit a written form from their family's healthcare provider will be exempt. Any questions should be directed to nurse at the school your child attends. NYS has now mandated the school health examination form; the new form is required starting July 1, 2018 and is available on the school website.

SPORTS PHYSICALS

Sports physicals are required **annually** for all athletes. Free sports physicals for fall athletes will be offered at the High School on **Thursday, June 6** *by appointment only*. Pre-screenings will begin at 8 am; please contact Mrs. Senus at 337-0101, ext. 1234 to schedule your child's appointment.

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR 6th GRADE ENTRANCE

The NYS Public Health Law requires that all students who enroll in 6th grade must provide documentation of receiving an immunization containing tetanus toxoids, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis (Tdap). Please contact Mrs. Habermehl at 337-0166, ext. 2101 with questions.

NEW IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENT

All students entering the 7th and 12th grades must have the meningococcal vaccine. Without it, they cannot start school. Check with your doctor. Even kids who have had a shot before may need a booster to start school. To learn more, visit health.ny.gov/immunize.

Exemptions from this requirement include the following:

- A medical exemption consisting of a written statement from a physician licensed to practice in the State of New York stating that there is a valid medical contraindication to the vaccine. A copy of the exemption must be retained by the school and will need to be reissued annually.
- A statement of religious exemption written by the parent(s) or guardian(s) of the student stating that they hold sincere and genuine religious belief(s) which prohibit the immunization of their child. A religious exemption must be approved by the school administration and the administrator may require additional documentation to support the application. Secular principles, including philosophical exemptions, are not allowed. A copy of the exemptions must be retained by the school.
